You know the way to the place where I am going.

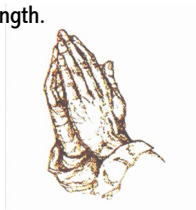

While growing up, Esther attended country school and high school in Madison, and furthered her education receiving her Teaching Certificate at Eastern State Normal in Madison, South Dakota.
