

*F*loyd Klinzman, age 95, of Storm Lake, Iowa died Wednesday, September 27, 2006 at Methodist Manor in Storm Lake.

Floyd Burton Klinzman was born December 6, 1910 near Cornell, Illinois to Daniel and Mabel Husted Klinzman. He moved with his family to Bagley, Iowa in 1919 where he graduated from high school in 1928.
