

David Lang, age 72, of Storm Lake, Iowa died Saturday, October 6, 2007 at the Buena Vista Regional Medical Center in Storm Lake, Iowa.

David was born in Ayrshire, Iowa, on April 3, 1935 to Anthony and Irene (Kleigl) Lang. Dave lived with his family in the Laurens area where he attended Laurens school for 10 1/2 years. His family moved to Storm Lake in 1953, where Dave attended and graduated from St. Mary's Catholic High School in 1954.

Additionally, Dave collected Cushman scooters, King Midget cars and trains. Dave will be remembered as a devoted father, grandfather and great grandfather.



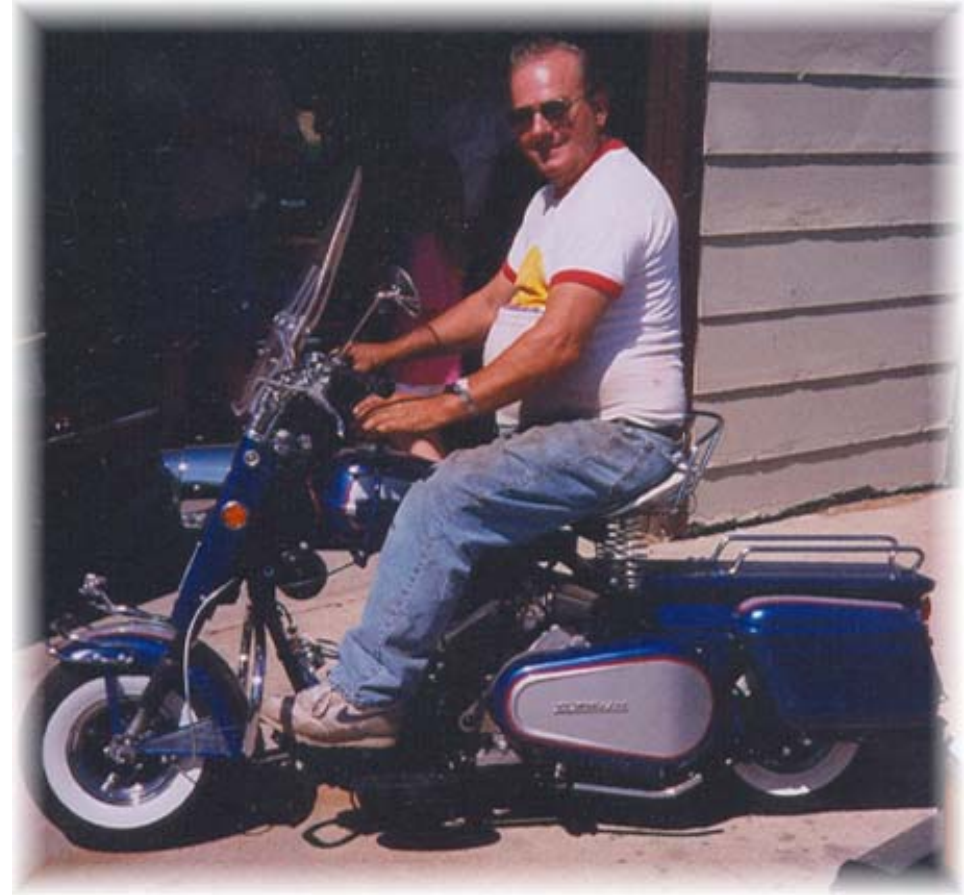
