Michael J. Dick, age 67, of Storm Lake, Iowa died on Friday, March 15, 2019 at the Buena Vista Regional Medical Center in Storm Lake.

Michael Joseph Dick, the son of Albert and Dorothy (Blass) Dick, was born on April 26, 1951 in Carroll, Iowa. He graduated high school from Crestland in 1969. After high school, Michael attended lineman school.

For 40 years, Michael worked for MidAmerican Energy until his retirement in 2013.

He enjoyed fishing, woodworking, automotive work, camping, and spending time with his dogs. He always liked to listen to Classic Rock music and taking Jan dancing.

When the scope arrived in Iowa, Mike sent me a rather terse email that he was dissatisfied that I had sent a scope that was less powerful than advertised and I had misrepresented it. Man did I blow hot ! Started typing out a reply as fast as my hunt and peck skills would allow. With the reply ready to go I paused before I hit send. I don't know why. I deleted the reply and slept on it. Next day I sent Mike copies of old Weaver brochures that explained the model designations and wrote maybe it was possible that he might have misunderstood what the model number on the scope meant. Mike sent me another email apologizing for jumping the gun. An Internet friendship was instantly created.

We soon learned that though 1500 miles separated us we had much in common. A shared interest in the gun hobby found emails back and forth with tips and advice about projects we were working on. When one of us added a new gun to the collection the first order of business was a show and tell with each other.

Years went by and one early morning in January four years ago my son Scott passed away. Numbed by grief I reached out to my friend Mike. What a comfort to me when I got his reply. He stayed in touch and wanted details of the service so that his son Brad (stationed in Jacksonville at the time).could attend. My wife, Robin and I met Brad at the service at the National cemetery. How thoughtful and what an effort for him to come. The guy had just had knee surgery and was on crutches.

Summer came and we knew we needed to get away for awhile. Opportunity for shared house with relatives on edge of Yellowstone. We decided to drive and see the country. I told Mike and asked about lodging close to him if we came by for a visit. He would hear none of that. You guys are staying with us!!

Understand that folks from Florida are not 100% positive that people really live in Iowa. Miles and miles of head high corn and then more miles and miles of head high corn greeted us. As we got closer to Mike and Jan's, Robin remarked, "this is the longest avenue (160th) I've ever seen". As we pulled into their driveway saw that head high corn surrounded us on three sides. "Build it and they will come", went through our minds.

What awaited was the warmest welcome anyone has a right to receive. Three days with them are now the fondest memories of the trip. Mike and I spent time in his shop working on a couple 22 rifles and did some shooting. How I wished I could have a shop like that in Florida. Jan and Robin made visits to antique shops close by and did some shopping.

The days went quickly with great food and conversation and too soon it was time to leave and head west. Both of us resolved that this wouldn't be our last visit. I cannot tell you how much it grieves me that it was. Mike is in Heaven now and with loved ones that passed before. Hope he gets a chance to meet My Scott .
