Barbara A. Loving, age 91, of Storm Lake, Iowa died January 20, 2023 at her residence in Storm Lake.

Funeral services will take place Monday, January 30, 2023 at 10:30 a.m. at the Grace Lutheran Church in Storm Lake. Burial will be in the Fairfield Township Cemetery in Albert City, Iowa. Barbara was then transferred to Ames, Iowa and while in Ames their daughter, Laura, and son, Charles, were born. Barbara was a homemaker and very active at Bethesda Lutheran Church. They also lived in Burnsville, Minnesota and Waterloo, Iowa.

Barbara was active in Camp Fire girls and the Lutheran church where she served on many various boards. She was involved in Ladies circle, choir, Sunday School, vacation bible school, altar guild and Stephen Ministry.

Barbara enjoyed volunteering at the hospital gift shop and delivering meals on wheels. She was currently a member of Grace Lutheran Church in Storm Lake.

In her younger years, she enjoyed bowling, skiing, fishing, traveling and cruises with family and friends. One thing Barbara enjoyed was their camping trips in their canvas top fold up camper, traveling to nearly every state and also Canada. Together, they also had a cabin on Lake Ida in Alexandria, Minnesota where they made many memories.
