



Dorothy Brashears

November 2, 1921 - August 1, 2017

Dorothy Irene Brashears, age 95, of Alta, Iowa passed away peacefully at her residence at Welcov in Alta on Tuesday, August 1, 2017.

Funeral services will be held Saturday, August 5, 2017 at 10:30 a.m. at the United Methodist Church in Alta. Burial will follow in the Woodlawn Cemetery in Alta with full military rites by the Alta VFW. Visitation will take place Friday, August 4, 2017 from 4-7:00 p.m. at the Fratzke & Jensen Funeral Home in Alta. In lieu of flowers, memorials may be made to Unity Point Hospice. Dorothy was born on November 2, 1921 in Central City, Iowa to Fred Egger and Lena (Boss) Egger. Dorothy was nicknamed "Dot" by her family and friends, and was known to all as a gentle, kind, and loving soul.

Dorothy grew up on a farm in Iowa and attended a one-room rural school at Jordon's Grove. After graduating from high school, Dorothy earned a Business Degree at the Capital City Commercial College in Des Moines, Iowa.

In 1943, during World War II, Dorothy enlisted in the Waves of the United States Navy. She attended boot camp at Hunter College in New York City and Yeoman's School in Stillwater, Oklahoma. She was stationed at Norfolk, Virginia Naval Base where she worked at the Torpedo School. Dorothy

remained there until her discharge in the spring of 1945. She was very proud of her service to her country.

It was at the Naval Base Library in Norfolk where Dorothy met the love of her life, Leroy Martain Brashears from Baltimore, Maryland. They were married in their Navy uniforms at the chapel on the Naval Base in Norfolk, on February 9, 1945, and settled into their first home in Waubeek, Iowa. Together, they were blessed with four children: Nancy, Patricia, Jeffrey, and Steven. In 1976, they relocated to Alta, Iowa where she lived the remainder of her life.

Dorothy and Leroy shared a love of traveling. Throughout their 72 ½ years of marriage, they travelled to all 50 states, all Canadian Provinces, and 42 countries. She had a passion for reading, jigsaw puzzles and exercising. In her spare time, she enjoyed playing Bingo and cards, especially Bridge. Dorothy enjoyed volunteering in her church, school and many other community organizations. Dorothy treasured spending time with her family and will be deeply missed by all who knew and loved her.
