



Ellen M. (Carney) Chalmers

April 15, 1916 - August 30, 2011

Ellen M. (Carney) Chalmers, age 95, of St. Louis, Missouri and formerly of Storm Lake, Iowa died August 30, 2011 at Manor Grove Nursing Home in St. Louis, Missouri. Ellen M. Carney was born April 15, 1916 in Storm Lake, Iowa the daughter of Edward and Mary (Fitzpatrick) Carney. Growing up, Ellen attended school and graduated from St. Mary's Catholic High School in 1932. Following high school graduation, Ellen went to secretarial school in Sioux City and then worked for the Federal Government in Omaha, Nebraska and later received a position with the Department of Army in Washington, D.C. While working at the Pentagon she met her husband, James A. Chalmers. They married on September 11, 1948 in Washington, D.C. and made their home in Arlington, Virginia where they raised their family. James died in 1998. In 2002, Ellen moved to the St. Louis, Missouri area to be near her daughter, Mary. Those left to cherish her memory include her children: John E.
