



Glennys Pederson

September 21, 1920 - May 24, 2014

On Saturday, May 24, 2014, Glennys Pederson, a child of God, passed into the waiting arms of her beloved Savior.

Glennys Pederson was born on September 21, 1920 to Ralph and Elsie (Garriott) Corderman on a farm near Nemaha, Iowa. She was baptized into the Christian faith in Sac City and she was later confirmed into the Lutheran faith in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. She attended school and graduated from Providence Consolidated School in Sulphur Springs, Iowa in 1937. Glennys graduated from Morningside College in Sioux City with a BA degree in Secondary Education/Music in 1941. While attending Morningside she met her future husband, M.R. (Pete) Pederson. They were married in 1942 after he had graduated from Denver University with his MS degree in Statistics. Pete was commissioned as a 2nd Lt. in the Army and she traveled with him to each Army post until he was sent overseas. After WWII they lived in Chicago for five years where Pete was employed at International Harvester.

Glennys and Pete moved to rural Storm Lake in 1949 to farm her parents' farm since they were retiring. In 1964 they moved to Storm Lake and built their new home on the lake. Pete and Glennys enjoyed their lake home for 42 years before moving to Lake Pointe Villa in 2006. Glennys taught school for 22 years – at Grand Meadow, Sulphur Springs, and Newell. Glennys was a charter member at Grace Lutheran Church in Storm Lake and played the organ for the first service after completion of the church. She taught Sunday

school and Bible school for many years and played the organ for 31 years. Glennys and her husband, Pete, worked diligently to establish Concordia Lutheran School in Storm Lake which successfully operated for 10 years of Christian education for area children. She continued to be active at Grace Lutheran Church and delighted in her Christian fellowship while living her remaining years at Lake Pointe Villa in Storm Lake. She also enjoyed volunteering at the Buena Vista Co. Hospital for several years.
