Linda would always lend a helping hand with big family holiday meals, cooking and cleaning up. She was an animal lover and enjoyed playing cards and other games. Linda and Adeline hosted nephews and nieces for summertime visits that included swimming at Twin Lakes State Park, movies and other fun.

With help from relatives, Linda and Adeline traveled to visit family in Arizona and Florida. Linda later traveled to family reunions in New York and Oregon. She enjoyed attending Bible Camp at Lake Okoboji.

Linn, as she liked to be called in her later years, was active in the local churches and liked to volunteer. She spent her last years at West Bend Health & Rehab Center, where the caring staff eased her passage to heaven.
