Marion "Tiny" Bragg, age 89, of Newell, Iowa, formerly of Spencer, Iowa, died June 23, 2021 at Cherokee Specialty Care in Cherokee, Iowa.

Marion E. "Tiny" Bragg was born October 23, 1931 to William E. and Vera (Mangham) Bragg in Greene County, Iowa.

Tiny, along with his twin brother Marvin, enlisted to serve their country on December 4, 1951, during the Korean Conflict. Tiny served as an aircraft electrician until 1955 and went on to continue his service in the Air Force Reserves until 1959.

Tiny drove truck over the road for many years and nearing his retirement began hauling gravel. He had a lifelong love of motorcycles and enjoyed traveling and riding trains on many trips. He also enjoyed model railroading.

Tiny was preceded in death by his parents, Bill and Vera Bragg, his sister Ruthe (Howard) Anderson, and his twin brother Marvin.
