Raymond Kevane, age 89, of Storm Lake, Iowa died on September 11, 2018 in Texas.

Graveside services will be held on Friday, November 9, 2018 at 11:00 a.m. at St. Mary's Catholic Cemetery in Storm Lake. In lieu of flowers, a memorial fund has been established.

Raymond was born in 1928, in Rembrandt, Iowa. He was the son of Michael and Sarah (Distel) Kevane. He was raised on the family farm in the town of Rembrandt and graduated from Rembrandt High School in 1946 going on to study at Loras College in Dubuque, Iowa. Later, he earned his doctorate in Rome, Italy where he traveled extensively throughout Europe. Among his achievements he served as a Captain in the Army National Guard.

He and his wife, Lillian, settled in Oregon to raise their three children while building his consulting business of twenty-six years.

He is survived by his wife, Lillian, his son, Mark, and his daughters, Karen (Nathaniel) and Mary (Jon), and grandchildren, Colin, Dawson, Dylan, Bennett and Greyson.
