Richard "Dick" Frank, age 81, of Schaller, Iowa died Saturday, July 26, 2014 at St. Luke's Regional Medical Center in Sioux City.

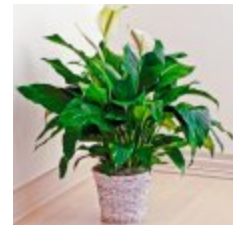
