Russell "Russ" Pepper, age 95, of Storm Lake, Iowa died Saturday, October 17, 2020 at the Buena Vista Regional Medical Center in Storm Lake.

Russell Leber Pepper was born April 16, 1925 in rural Arthur, Iowa the son of George and Nettie (Leber) Pepper.

Growing up, Russell attended school in the Galva and Cherokee area. He graduated from Galva High School in 1943.

On September 30, 1944, Russ was united in marriage to Shirley Babcock at her parent's farm home near Galva, Iowa. Together, they were blessed with

four children: Pat, Larry, Craig and Bill.

On March 15, 1946, Russell enlisted in the United States Army where he proudly served his country during World War II until he was honorably discharged on December 24, 1946. Prior to his enlistment, he worked in the Boeing Defense Plants in Renton, Washington building B-29's. His fascination with those planes continued his whole life.

Russ was a member of the United Methodist Church in Storm Lake; Storm Lake Jaycees where he served as president; Storm Lake Chamber of Commerce; West Central Iowa Home Builders where he served as president' Iowa HBA and Independent Order of Odd Fellows.

Russ was a well-respected general contractor for many years in the Storm Lake community. He often said the mentoring of Art Dahl, Omar Roth, and Frank Baustian helped to make his construction business a success. He built 49 homes in the Storm Lake area.

In his spare time, Russ enjoyed golf, reading, and travelling. Russ never met a stranger. He loved a good conversation and a good dish of ice cream. Family was very important to Russ and he will be deeply missed by all who knew and loved him.

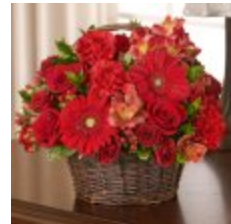

“ I can honestly say Russ was one of the nicest guys I've ever known. it was a real shock to see his obituary. We first met Russ in 1964 when we moved here from Mn. We needed housing desperately as we had to get out of our rental house for the owner to move in. Housing was so short in SL we decided we had to build. I was in the E. W. Oates Co Lumber yard looking for something and Russ somehow knew we had to build and he came up and introduced himself and I liked him from that moment on. And he and Gene Babcock started the house in September and had it ready for us to move in by December!

Over the years I did insurance business with Russ and Larry for their construction company and he was always a gentleman. They retired and moved to Vegas. One year we stopped in Vegas on the way to CA. We were going through a casino there and ran on to Russ and Shirley. They kind of showed us around the area. In future years, we had stopped there and spend some time with them.
