Sallie Caboth, age 91, of Alta, Iowa passed away on Wednesday, April 7, 2021 in Kelley, Iowa.

Funeral services will be held on Monday, April 12, 2021 at 10:30 a.m. at the Fratzke & Jensen Funeral Home in Alta. Burial will be in the Woodlawn Cemetery in Alta. On September 19, 1948, Sallie was united in marriage to Desel Caboth in Marcus. The couple was blessed with two children, Carla and Cragon.

In her free time, Sallie enjoyed camping, quilting, beadwork, and reading. Sallie and Desel are known for the finished crafts that they shared with friends such as her bead trees.
