Scott A. Jackson, age 54, of Albert Lea, Minnesota formerly of Storm Lake, Iowa died April 7, 2017 in Albert Lea.

Memorial services will be held Saturday, April 22, 2017 at 1:00 p.m. at St. Mark Lutheran Church in Storm Lake. Burial will be in the Storm Lake Cemetery. loved spending time with his family, especially playing with his nieces and nephews. He will be deeply missed by all who knew and loved him.

I then asked my mom to hang up the phone after about five minutes, I hopped on my bike and rode over to his house. I pulled into the back of house where he was sitting on the steps of the back porch with the phone still up to ear. He looked at me, rolled his eyes and said "What took you so long?"

We had many adventures over the years and I am deeply saddened that we will not share any more. We fully expected to be meeting annually to watch the original "Star Wars" when we were in our 80's. You could always count on Scotty to make you smile and laugh. Lookout heaven, laughter is coming your way!
